

\$3,277 Donation to Ronald McDonald House generated by our first ever Cruise for a Cause

Charles Nance and I have generated a donation of \$3,277 for our first ever Cruise for a Cause. We had an awesome time traveling together with our group, and we hope that more members, and friends and family of members, will want to join in for our 2023 Cruise for a Cause 2!

The way the donation works is that when I have a 'group' on a sailing, I would get a \$\$ credit back for every 8 cabins booked into the group for being the group leader. The purpose of the credit is so the group leader working their tail off gets to sail for 'free'. I have committed that Charles and I will pay full price, and I'll turn the group leader credit (s) over to the Ronald McDonald House.

We get the credit for each denomination of 8 cabins we get into the group, so 8, 16, 24, 32 etc cabins we'll keep getting the credit. The more people book, the more our donation will end up being! The value of the credit is the average cruise fare paid to the cruise line but not counting the port fees or the taxes. So, once we've successfully sailed, they send me the money as they've calculated it.

This year we had 12 cabins, so I earned one credit to donate, plus all the guests on the cruise opted to have me give \$50 I would have given them as a thank-you gift for booking with me over to the Ronald McDonald House as well. That made it larger. I won't be able to do that with every cruise line, as they all do groups differently, but it worked that way on Princess Cruises.



Our cruise included stops in Newport RI, Boston MA, Bar Harbor, Maine, St John and Halifax, Canada.







Thumbnail Book Reviews

All the Lonely People by Mike Gayle. "Ah, look at all the lonely people; where do they all come from?" As I read this book, the lyrics of the song kept running through my head. Hubert Bird, an 84-year-old Jamaican immigrant living in London for the past 60 years, just wants to be left alone. He's all alone and lonely and he thinks he likes it that way. When his new neighbor, Ashleigh, and her young daughter, Layla, knock on his door one day making friendly overtures to get acquainted, Hubert rebuffs them. When Hubert's daughter Rose writes to say she's coming to visit in a few weeks, he panics because he's been telling Rose stories about the gay old life he's living with his friends, and the truth is: he has no friends at all! The story then takes us through all the gyrations Hubert makes in discovering that he has a knack for convincing people that they should get together and fight against loneliness. It is quite a romp involving the whole community, and before you know it, Hubert is the president of the "Campaign to End Loneliness in Bromley"! In reading about this book, it is often compared to "A Man Called Ove." I think you will have to read it to decide whether you agree on how Hubert measures up to Ove....

Lessons in Chemistry by Bonnie Garmus. I'm not even remotely interested in chemistry and never have been. But this book captured my heart almost immediately. From the dog, named Six-Thirty, with a vocabulary of 600+ words, to the precocious daughter, Mad (short for Madeline), to the protagonist, Elizabeth Zott, scientist extraordinaire, who is overlooked as a woman and receives no credit for her smartness (her work is credited to her male counterpart), this story rollicks along, carrying the reader to new heights of respect for a woman of courage who is not afraid to stand up for herself, in spite of everything! The fact that Elizabeth can sell her chemical knowledge and make it interesting to the general public through a cooking show on television is testimony to her intelligence and her dedication to her profession. This may be Bonnie Garmus's first book of fiction, but it surely will not be her last.

I Am Not Who You Think I Am by Eric Rickstad. This book was my book club's selection for September. Wayland Maynard is eight years old when he witnesses his father's self-inflicted death and finds a hand-written note that says "I am not who you think I am." Over the years Wayland begins to experience doubts that the man he saw dying was his father. He has never shown the note to anyone, and he engages in investigating whether the handwriting on the note is indeed his father's. This is a dark story with a lot of twists and turns that may or may not intrigue the reader. In fact, there are as-

pects of the story that, in going unresolved, caused me to lower my overall appreciation of the book.

The Summer Wives by Beatriz Williams. I love, love, love Beatriz Williams' historical novels! And The Summer Wives did not disappoint, not one iota! With alternating timelines between 1930 and 1969, she captures the lifestyle of the elegant summer residents of Winthrop Island in Long Island Sound as it collides with the lifestyle of the working-class year-around residents of the island, descendants of Portuguese fishermen. Of course, Miranda Schuyler, stepdaughter of one of the summer residents, falls in love with Joseph Vargas, the son of the keeper of the local lighthouse. And thus begins the drama that turns this novel into one of intrigue and romance, enough to keep the reader eagerly turning the pages until the end.

The Dark Hours by Michael Connelly. Another caper with Renee Ballard and Harry Bosch leading the way as only they can do under the skilled pen of Michael Connelly. It's murder, of course, along with a pair of serial rapists using the tag of the "Midnight Men," that keeps us reading as Renee takes the investigative lead with Harry, in near-retirement, advising her and watching out for her as only he can. Another page turner from one of the best mystery writers out there!
