Manifesting My First Corvette

I live by the words "Believe It to Receive It". Then, being in the "flow," send the request out to the Universe and wait. The Universe never fails to return a request, sometimes in surprising ways.

I wasn't thinking about Corvettes, or any cars for that matter, when I met Monty for the first time at a local bar/restaurant in Scottsdale, AZ. Meeting someone on a singles site over the internet most of the time is challenging, but Monty seemed nice enough on the phone and had a house nearby in Scottsdale. I decided to accept Monty's offer to meet him, so I ventured out on a Wednesday night. We had chicken wings and a beer, something I wouldn't typically order, but it seemed to be Monty's favorite. Our conversation was diverse, but then turned to cars, fast cars. He told me he had a 2016 red Dodge Challenger sitting in his garage at his house. He asked me what kind of fast car I liked. Thinking back, I had owned two convertible sport cars, a BMW Z3 and an Alfa Romeo Veloce. These cars were older, not very fast, not very expensive, but fun to drive, sort of. Monty let out a little laugh and said "Well, why don't you go buy one?" I felt like he was a little condescending. He didn't know anything about me, my situation, or how I could manifest when I put my mind to it. That night sparked the fire in me, which led me to purchase my first Corvette.

The next day, I looked on the Autotrader website for Corvettes. I was looking for a newer vehicle, but not at a dealership, since I really do not like dealing with dealerships. I would travel by flight to see the best one from my selection, then order a transport to ship it back to me once it was purchased. The one I really liked was in Connecticut. Now it's Friday early evening, just two days after I met Monty at the local bar. He texted me "Have you bought a Corvette yet?" along with a smiley face. I thought "what a jerk, it's only been two days." I wasn't going out anywhere that Friday night, so I sat down with a glass of wine and started the process of building a Corvette on the Chevrolet website. It took me about two hours to go through each item to select, since there were a lot of selections and I had to familiarize myself with some of the unique items. I finally made it to the end, pressed the button that showed "build and find your vehicle" and voila, there it was, my exact build just 20 miles away at a Chevrolet dealership in Avondale. It showed the MSRP price, but I heard that dealerships were selling new vehicles 10 to 20K over MSRP. Still, I was so excited that I called the dealership up right away to see if they still had "my" car. I thought, I'll just sit in it, get the feel for what it would be like to own one. I hoped someone would answer, since it was about 8:45 pm on a Friday night. Someone answered and said yes, the car is still there. I told them that I couldn't make it to their dealership until the following Tuesday night. As the man who answered the phone chuckled, we made an appointment for the following week. After we hung up, I remembered that they sell fast, therefore the chuckle thinking the car would not be there the following Tuesday. I knew that if it was meant to be, then the Vette would still be at the dealership, just for me.

The following Tuesday afternoon I called the dealership to see if they still had the Vette that I selected. Yes, they did and yes, I can stop by to take a look at it. When I arrived at the dealership, they connected me with a salesman, Charles Moore. I told Charles that I was there to see the gray Corvette. He told me that he had just sold the gray one, but he had three remaining at a "special" price. He said Chevrolet provided 12 Corvettes to their dealership to sell at MSRP (no markup) as a Superbowl special. I was told that Chevrolet selected the Avondale dealership, since it was the closest to the stadium hosting the Superbowl in 2023. Charles took me to the back lot where he showed me a yellow, then a black Corvette, but neither appealed to me. He took me to see the last Vette, on the other side of the outdoor display area and there it was....MY Corvette. I told Charles that was the vehicle I was looking for all along. We then had a discussion about the color gray. My Vette is Ceramic Gray (officially Ceramic Matrix Gray Metallic), but Charles thought I was looking for Hypersonic Gray. Charles opened the door so I could look inside, then take a seat. At that moment, I knew the Universe always keeps its promise to deliver and it just did it again. That night, I put a deposit down and the next day, I was officially the owner of a new Corvette. I didn't pick up my vehicle until the following Saturday morning, since I had the wheels powder coated black and added paint protective film to the front and sides. Haves and Wants

Haves - You can offer something for sale, you can offer to give something away, or you might "have" information/advice about the Corvette you think other members might be interested in.

Wants - Would be the reverse. You are looking for a part, or maybe just advice.

Haves

Advice - From member Peter Boland

I have a friend who's been in automotive service most of his life, also a passionate road course racer. He's the Owner, Builder & Driver of car #14 Advanced Autoworks and, is the main principal of that company. From a grocery getter to full blown beast, the Gent. is a walking encyclopedia.

Saw him earlier this week and, as usual got a dose of arcane information regarding our LT1 engines (a lively topic, I used to build engines back in the late 60's early 70's we compare technology of both circa).

The 'tid-bits';

1) Carbon buildup on intake valves (topside). Our fuel injectors are mounted in such a way, where by fuel is jetted directly into the combustion chamber. The job of the intake valve is to bring in air provided by the throttle body. Performance wise, optimal arrangement but, with a down side. The gas never runs over the top of the valve as in conventional engines, washing the topside. Thus, a carbon buildup begins to form, starting on day one. There are reports of one quarter inch build-up's, consequently head removal is required, along with manual cleaning.

Fortunately there's an aftermarket 'fix' that eliminates the potential. It's known as a *"catch can,*" UPR CSS-5030-96-CSS, priced at \$349.95. Installation is relatively simple. Anyone who's mildly capable of spinning a wrench should be able to do it. For full details, google 'Catch Can' followed by Pt. No. Code.

2) Fuel Additive; I don't remember the exact number but, the force generated by the injection system is incredible. I've always viewed liquid additives as 'snake oil' for the uninitiated. Times change, a product that's highly recommended is BG44K fuel additive. Add to a full tank every few months for clean injectors.

Don't know about the rest of the gang but, I wasn't aware of any of the foregoing.
