Suzy Poulter and Charles Nance present the Club's first ERay!





After putting down our deposit on February 1, 2023, thinking we were going to get a 2024 ERay, we FINALLY got our 2025 on Sunday, October 4, 2024. We were in the first run of the 2025 model year, number x42, built September 12, 2024.

It is **NOT** an electric car like a Tesla. It is a hybrid car, but not like a Prius. Its' a performance hybrid like other exotic supercars are frequently made these days. It doesn't plug in and the milage is no better than a Stingray. The hybrid system is not for fuel efficiency, it's to add more horsepower and torque. Officially it has 655 HP and 595 pound feet of torque. 0-60 time is 2.5 seconds and it can do the quarter mile in 10.5 seconds.

It has the same V8 used in the C8 Stingray, with a small electric motor in the front that drives the front wheels – making it All Wheel Drive. It also has a wide body, like a Z06.

So, it's an AWD Wide Body Corvette. If you notice a wide body on the road, then you can tell the Z06 from the ERay because the Z06 has four tail pipes in the center, and the ERay has a pair on each side... like C8 Stingrays have.

If we wish, we can start it in "stealth" all-electric mode to creep quietly out of the house / neighborhood and then when we punch it up above 45 mph the gas engine kicks in. We can't go very far on the all-electric mode, but it's fun when leaving early for Cars & Coffee! The added electric motor for the front wheels works seamlessly with the V8 engine driving the back wheels. We just feel the gas engine, but we have a LOT more zip from starts and around corners.

The ERay is ours, not just Charles' and not just Suzy's. We negotiated every option in the build, and we love the final look! It's Riptide Blue, with black interior and tons of red accents. We take turns driving, with plenty of time for each of us. - Suzy and Charles

Amazon Fulfillment Center Tour September 19, 2024 By Rich Kosina

On Thursday September 19, eleven Club members gathered at the QT on Cave Creek Rd north of the Loop 101. The group then caravaned on the 101 and I-10 arriving at the Amazon Fulfillment Warehouse in Avondale for a tour at noon. Two Amazon staffers welcomed us, went over the tour rules, and for the next hour plus led us through the massive facility.

The center portion of the building is operated by computer driven robots traveling in every direction. Circling the center area are human workers. The humans place the items in bins and conveyors move the bins to other humans which box the orders. Other conveyors move the packages to carts which are then rolled on to semitrailers. The trailers depart daily headed to distribution warehouses all over the southwest. From those warehouses the packages are loaded onto vans to be delivered to our homes.

Avondale Facility Fun Facts:

- -4500 employees work on multiple shifts.
- -Building is 1.2M sq ft.
- -The facility only handles items the size of a microwave or smaller.
- -There are 52 of these facilities in the USA. 1/per State except TX & CA which have 2.
- -The facility does not send any packages directly to our homes.
- -Over 300 semi-trailers depart the facility daily to their distribution warehouses.
- -All those brown cardboard boxes they use come from a local vendor in Glendale.
- -Soon the vinyl flat envelopes we often get will be replaced with brown paper ones.

Upon completing the tour our Amazon tour guide insisted we drive by so he could capture photos to submit to corporate. The group then drove to Cheddar's Scratch Kitchen for lunch. Thank you to Angie and Rich Kosina for setting up this trip.










Haves and Wants


