



A press release from Corvette Racing dated December 29, 2008:

Corvette Racing program manager Doug Fehan is quick to reconfirm Corvette Racing's GT1 program in the first half of the 2009 American Le Mans Series.

"The primary focus of the race team is the 12 Hours of Sebring, Long Beach and, of course as it always has been, the 24 Hours of Le Mans," Fehan said. "We tested the GT1 car at Sebring in November. And we will be utilizing Sebring and Long Beach to put the final touches on the Le Mans effort. We're continuously developing the car and package for fuel mileage, efficiency and new materials from our various suppliers. We want our last GT1 appearance at Le Mans to be successful. The team understands the importance of a victory at Sebring, Long Beach and Le Mans to close the GT1 program."

The highly anticipated GT2 Corvette is still scheduled to debut at Mid-Ohio in early August, Fehan added.

"Engineering and fabrication continues to focus on the GT2 program," he said. "We expect the first actual race car to be completed in early February and will be testing that car in the spring."

The media says that American auto makers are not producing vehicles that the American people want. This article dated December 15, 2008, sent to me by my Wickenburg friend, would seem to refute that idea, as GM is going full speed ahead on testing the Chevy Equinox, the fuel-cell electric vehicle being developed by GM.

Equinox Test Fuel Cell Electrics Are Nearing 500K Miles -- edmunds.com/

Dec. 15, 2008

Despite financial woes that threaten the automaker's survival, General Motors is continuing research on a fuel-cell electric vehicle, announcing that sometime this week one of the 100 Chevy Equinox FCEVs being driven in Los Angeles, New York and Washington, D.C., as part of Chevrolet's Project Driveway will drive the 500,000th zero-emissions mile of the real-world test program.

"This is a huge accomplishment, because we learn something about our vehicles, the hydrogen infrastructure and consumer acceptance of fuel-cell vehicles with every mile driven," Mary Beth Stanek, director of GM Fuel Cell Commercialization, said in a statement.

Fuel-cell cars and SUVs convert hydrogen and oxygen to electricity through an onboard electro-chemical reaction. The electricity is then used to power the vehicles' drive motors.

Stanek said candid feedback on "everything from the way the vehicle looks to technical input on brake 'feel' and performance

to fueling experiences" has led to the resolution of several hundred customer issues.

The program has also provided Stanek and others associated with the Equinox with insight into how these vehicles are being used under real-world driving conditions, she said.

"We've been able to use these experiences to extend fuel-cell stack life and improve the regenerative braking system, which has already benefited our two-mode hybrid vehicles since it's the same brake system used on the Saturn Vue, Chevy Tahoe and GMC Yukon two-mode hybrids," she said.

No automaker is saying that it expects to make FCEVs available for purchase this side of 2020, but without programs such as Project Driveway they likely would never appear in a showroom.



RARE 1937 BUGATTI FOUND IN ENGLISH GARAGE

Dusty two-seater expected to bring millions at auction next month



LONDON - It was the equivalent of finding an old Picasso or an unknown Beatles tape hidden away in your uncle's attic.

Relatives of Dr. Harold Carr found an extremely rare 1937 Bugatti Type 57S Atalante - a Holy Grail for car collectors as they were going through his belongings after his death.

The dusty two-seater, unused since 1960, didn't look like much in the garage in Gosforth, near Newcastle in northern England.

But only 17 were ever made, and when it's cleaned up and auctioned in Paris next month, experts believe it will fetch at least 3 million pounds (\$4.3 million) and possibly much more.

Bugatti once represented the height of motoring achievement. The supercar was so ahead of its time it could go up to 130 mph when most other cars topped out about 50 mph.

This particular car is even more valuable because it was originally owned by Earl Howe, a prominent British racecar driver, and because its original equipment is intact, so it can restored without relying on replacement parts. It has just 26,000 miles on the clock.

Owner described as eccentric hoarder

"It has all the finest attributes any connoisseur collector could ever seek, in one of the ultimate road-going sports cars from the golden era of the 1930s," said James Knight, head of the international motoring department at Bonhams, which will auction the car Feb. 7.

Knight and a small number of Bugatti enthusiasts knew of Carr's proudest possession, but not the eight relatives who inherited Carr's estate.

The orthopedic surgeon, who died at age 89, was described by relatives as an eccentric hoarder who never threw anything out. He also left behind an Aston Martin, which was sold, and a Jaguar sports car that was scrapped because it was in such poor condition.

The Bugatti marque is famed for its speed and handling and was a frequent race winner in the 1920s and 1930s. The 57S Atalante was one of its most successful models, each one made by hand with unique details.

The company founded in 1909 by Ettore Bugatti collapsed in the 1940s after a long string of racing victories.

The rights to the legendary Bugatti name were purchased in 1998 by Volkswagen, which has built the Bugatti Veyron, one of the world's fastest and most expensive cars.

BOOK REVIEW

For the mystery reader, "Stalking Susan" by Julie Kramer will be an entertaining story. For the avid television viewer, it describes the day-to-day toil of a television news reporter, Riley Spartz, and her photograph sidekick, Malik. Riley is given two cold cases by a longtime police source. Both cases involve murders of women named Susan that occurred on the same date, November 19, in consecutive years. Riley starts researching and finds more cases involving the murders or apparent suicides of other women named Susan on November 19. She uncovers some surprising similarities and disparities that start to show a connection in some but not all of the cases. As November 19 approaches, Riley stages a bold on-air stunt to try to draw the killer out before he can commit the next murder.

This book has a setting I can relate to - Minneapolis-St. Paul. You will be rooting for Riley to uncover the solution to the Susan murders and at the same time you will get an authentic look at the television news industry. The author is a former producer for WCCO-TV in Minneapolis.




