SKY DIVING IN A WIND TUNNEL

A small group from our Club had a very exciting Saturday on January 24th. We headed out to the small town of Eloy, about 60 miles southwest of Phoenix, for a unique experience of "mock skydiving." Not many from our group had the ambition to participate in this adventure as only three couples ultimately took the plunge, the Sipruts, Cassels, and the Harders.

Even though it was a small group we thoroughly enjoyed the experience of SkyVenture, which features a 175 foot tall "wind tunnel." After our group went through training by experienced skydivers, we were outfitted in jumping suits, helmets, and goggles. We watched the experienced divers go first in the wind tunnel where they looked like "spider-man" creatures zooming up and diving down in the tunnel using all kinds of gymnastic moves and gestures. Very intimidating to watch. Each of our adventurous crew took individual turns in the tunnel with an instructor. Because of the wind noise in the tunnel, part of the pre-flight instructions included learning a number of hand signals which are used to communicate while in the tunnel. When in the tunnel. each diver is attempting to find the perfect body position, where legs, arms, head, hips, hands, etc, are properly aligned for a perfect flight. Every small movement of a body part causes a reaction in the tunnel, even moving ones fingers. It was all very exciting, as each member of our crew took two separate turns in the tunnel.

Although the tunnel had some glass walls for viewing, attempting to take photos was a challenge as the walls are curved and constantly reflected the light from the flash so they ended up of poor quality.

SkyVenture is located at a small airport along with a skydiving facility which offered our group a special bonus, watching dozens of real skydivers jumping out of planes and parachuting down attempting to land on small targets. None in the group had ever seen so many skydivers coming down at once in their colorful chutes. In spite of the fun and excitement, none in our group are inspired to jump out of an airplane but would definitely return to the wind tunnel for another "mock sky diving" experience!

Corvette Grand Sport #002 By Mark Bales

Every January hundreds of beautiful Corvettes fill the Barrett-Jackson, Russo and Steele and RM auction tents. From restored C1's up to and including the new ZR-1, the 2009 auction season was no different... With one exception.

The most historically significant Corvette in existence today crossed the block at RM's auction, held at the Biltmore. Corvette Grand Sport chassis #002 is one of only five Grand Sports ever produced.

Before we get into why this Corvette is so special, a little background on the Grand Sport program might be in order.

Grand Sport Program

In 1962, Zora Arkus-Duntov had a mission. He wanted to build a Corvette that could compete and beat the purpose built race cars from Europe and the Shelby Cobras. The RPO ZO6 "Racer package" offered on the '63 Stingray had potential, but two major problems were apparent. The Stingray weighed 50% more than its competition, and the drum brakes were prone to failure.

With approval from Bunkie Knudson, head of Chevrolet, the project began in secret. The top GM brass was determined to honor the 1957 Automobile Manufacturers Association ban on direct involvement in racing. Using lightweight materials, disc brakes, the Stingray's proven four-wheel independent suspension and a 377 c.i. V-8, the Grand Sport program was underway, but not for long.

In December of 1962, Arkus-Duntov took chassis #001 to Sebring for testing. A month later, GM's Chairman, Frederic Donner put a stop to all racing

efforts. But that didn't stop Arkus-Duntov! He loaned the cars to privateers for SCCA racing. Results were mixed, but Dr. Dick Thompson took #004 to an overall victory at the SCCA Nationals at Watkins Glen. Cars #003, #004 and #005 also had some success during the 1963 Nassau Speed Week finishing third, fourth and sixth, well ahead of the Cobras.

In preparation for the Daytona endurance race in February of 1964, Arkus-Duntov's engineers converted Grand Sport coupe # 001 and #002 to roadsters by amputating their roofs to reduce their profile and frontal area. Special louvered hoods were also fitted to relieve the engine compartment pressure problem. Unfortunate-

ly, the cars never made it to Daytona. GM Corporate brass heard about Chevy's continuing involvement, and ordered the cars destroyed.

Fortunately, they never faced the crusher. Insiders quickly shipped the three coupes off to privateers. The two roadsters where sold to Roger Penske in 1966. All five survive today.



Chassis #002

In 1966, Penske sold the car to George Wintersteen. The car's entire racing history comes from the Wintersteen years. It was past its prime, but had some limited success in the 1966 USRRC. At the end of the season, Wintersteen sold the car to Ed Mueller who kept the car in the same condition. In Corvette Grand Sport #002

1990, the car was sold to Jim Jaeger who still owned the car when it was offered at RM in January.

And now we get to why this is the most historically significant Corvette, even more so than its other four siblings. This is the only Grand Sport that has never been restored. Yes, it has been "reconditioned" but never restored.

Mr. Jaeger wanted to vintage race #002, but realized how important it was. He had to go through a thought process common in automobile restora-

tion. At what point in time do you pick for the restoration? The original body was too frail for rigorous racing, and too historical to risk destroying. So, he decided to preserve the original body and running gear from the Wintersteen period, and build a duplicate body to replicate its original factory appearance. Thus the "two" cars you see in accompanying photos. Wintersteen's white with the blue stripe, and the original looking blue car.

Although Wintersteen raced the car with a 427, Arkus-Duntov intended the cars to be powered by his then-new 377 V-8. So, Mr. Jaeger had one built. The second body, the 377 V-8 and other original pieces were offered with the car at RM, who expected the car to sell at over \$7.9 million.



Alas, for whatever reason, bad economy, etc., the car failed to meet the reserve. Bidding stopped at \$4.9 million.

From RM Auctions, quoting Jerry Burton in his biography of Zora Arkus-Duntov, "The Grand Sport may not have earned Duntov any political gold stars on the Fourteenth Floor, but what he did achieve constituted an indelible contribution to Corvette's racing pedigree, and to the dreams and aspirations of American road racing fans."

If only Zora could have lived to see the success of the C5-R and C6R...

GT1 CHAMPIONSHIP EDITION ANNOUNCED FOR 2009

(Thanks to Member **Berny Rasch** for suggesting this feature!)

Breaking News (January 26, 2009) - Tom Hill, Quality Engineering Manager of the Bowling Green Assembly Plant, announced on Saturday night, January 24, 2009 to the crowd present at the NCRS Awards Banquet in Kissimmee, Florida, that a GT1 Championship Edition would be built starting this Spring.

The 2009 GT1 Championship Edition would be available in Coupe, Convertible and Z06 models. They will include your choice of 45U Velocity Yellow or 41U Black exterior paint with C6.R graphics inspired by our victorious Pratt & Miller Racing Team. This striping package will have a familiar "JAKE" theme running through the Black and Silver design. A very unique feature will include graphics that will have the driver's names on the roof just like the C6.R has. Of course, the Championships that the C6.R has won will be displayed on a lower door script graphic. The uniqueness continues with Black headlamps on the Velocity Yellow models including Genuine Corvette Accessories use on the body with colored

door handles and a carbon patterned engine cover.

All models will include the ZR1 full width spoiler in body color, Q9V Forged Chrome Wheels (export models will only have QG7 Polished Wheels), Z51 Performance Package and NPP Performance Exhaust for Coupe and Convertible. Each will receive a distinctive yellow windshield banner for installation.

All models will have exclusive GT1 embroidery on the seats and console lid. Ebony 4LT (Coupe and Convertible) and 3LZ (Z06) interiors and shifter will be accentuated with yellow stitching. Included will be a Special Console Trim Plate with specific VIN sequencing and a Certificate of Authenticity. Options reportedly available will include C2L Dual Roof Panels for the Coupe, U3U Navigation on all models, and MX0 6-speed paddle shift automatic on Coupe and Convertible.

Our best guess at prices at release time are:

* Coupe \$65,500 * Convertible \$72,000 * Z06 \$86,500

Expect limited production.



MAY 1-3 HISTORIC ROUTE 66 FUN RUN


