FROM THE DRIVER'S SEAT By Manny Siprut

2011 has continued to be an active year for our Club. In mid-March, several of us participated in a weekend trip to Lake Havasu, followed by a scheduled epicurean dinner in late March. Then in April our Club participated in the Copperstate 1000 by attending the Start and Car Show at Diablo Stadium, followed by a lunch that afternoon. And, attendance at our monthly meetings this year has averaged over 40 members, a very nice improvement over previous years.

In my last Newsletter article, I commented on our annual survey which we completed in February, and mentioned that I would be providing more feedback to the membership at our March Dinner Meeting, which I did. However, since all of our members were not present, I thought it would helpful to repeat my comments for this article.

2011 SCC Member Survey Summary Comments:

This was the second year we completed a "membership satisfaction survey" and again we received some very positive feedback and valuable comments from our members. In 2010, 43 surveys were completed and returned and 37 were completed and returned for 2011. Although the survey contained a number of questions/issues that were to be graded, the four key questions to be rated on a 1 - 5 scale (with 5 being the highest) along with your ratings were:

Overall quality of the monthly dinner meetings	3.98	4.36
Overall rating for our Club activities	4.26	4.57
Enjoyment of your membership	4.42	4.72
Leadership of the Club	4.56	4.78

As you can see, the ratings were relatively high for 2010, and without exception were even higher this year. In reality, the 2010 survey rated 2009 and the 2011 survey rated 2010. Our members certainly recognized the Board of Directors by providing them the highest score of any of the items on the survey for Leadership.

The lowest rated item on the Survey was for the "quality of food" at our monthly meetings, which was rated at 3.47, which in reality is basically a C+. Not bad, but certainly not a strong rating, and the same rating as on our 2010 survey. Seeing how we are rating the same place/food, we are at least consistent.

Since we have so many members that have joined us in the last couple of years, the Board thought this would be a good opportunity to review our history and requirements for our monthly Dinner Meeting facility. Our Club has nine (9) basic criteria for a dinner facility:

- Good parking where our members are comfortable with the safety of their cars
- 2. Reasonably nice facility and amenities

- 3. Central Scottsdale location
- Private room without competing noise or distractions
- Separate checks
- 6. Reasonable pricing
- 7. Reasonable quality of food
- 8. Satisfactory service from mgmt and staff
- Facility must be able to accommodate varying guest attendance from 20 to 50 guests

On the surface this may not sound like a challenge to meet, but in fact prior to using the Gainey Ranch facility, our Club had many negative experiences over the prior seven years and had great difficulty identifying a location that satisfied us on these nine items. So, even though we only give them a grade of "average +" on their food, the facility continues to meet our overall requirements.

The reason we evolved to the "buffet" was so that we could simplify and speed up the process of ordering, serving, and paying for our meals. This way our meeting time is totally focused on socializing, holding our meeting, and enjoying our meal. What we had to give up was that each member has a limited choice of food items, and basically the cost of the meal is the cost of attending the meeting.

Again, the Board wants to thank all of the members who participated in the Survey and for your valuable comments.

Moving on. In May, Walter has scheduled an exciting trip to Bryce Canyon and Las Vegas. The Club continues to experience nice participation with our monthly Vette Vixens' Dinners and Men's Night Out (mostly poker). These are really fun, so if you are not joining us, I would encourage you to check these out.

Please take note that there are no Club activities scheduled for July. That is, no monthly dinner, Vixens dinner, or poker, etc. Also for August, we have moved all of our activities out a week. Therefore, our August Dinner Meeting will be on the 17th , Vette Vixens on the 24th, and the Board meeting on the 31st.




A View of the London Bridge at Night



The wait staff seemed overwhelmed so a line formed at the bar to get our beer, wine and cocktails.



Film on Corvette 50-Years at LeMans

CARLISLE, Pa., April 8, 2011 - Last year's 24 Hours of Le Mans marked the 50th anniversary of Corvette's first participation in the world's most celebrated sports car race. Fifty years after Briggs Cunningham's No. 3 Corvette finished first in the large displacement GT category, the restored race car was reunited with one of its legendary drivers, John Fitch, at the fabled French circuit. Now the remarkable story of this milestone Corvette's return to Le Mans is told in a new documentary film, "The Quest."

The Chip Miller Charitable Foundation (CMCF) will premiere this moving documentary created by award-winning filmmaker Michael Brown on Friday, May 6, at the Carlisle Theatre in Carlisle, Pa. Tickets for the premiere are available at www.QuestDocumentary.com, and all proceeds will benefit the Foundation.

"The Premiere of 'The Quest' is going to be a unique, must-attend event," said Lance Miller, co-owner of Carlisle Events. "The film is about so much more than cars. I think everyone, in their own way, will find an emotional connection to this story."

The film recounts how the No. 3 Corvette disappeared into obscurity after winning its class at Le Mans. It follows the quest of renowned Corvette enthusiast Chip Miller to find, restore, and ultimately return this milestone automobile to France to celebrate the golden anniversary of its historic victory. Following Miller's untimely death in 2004, his dream of returning the No. 3 Cunningham Corvette to Le Mans lived on through his son Lance and the Miller family.

Wearing traditional American white and blue racing colors, the immaculately restored Corvette participated in a parade through downtown Le Mans and led 50 Corvettes on a ceremonial lap of the track before the start of the 24-hour race with Fitch at the wheel. Fitch, now 93 years old, and the historic Corvette will attend the premiere to help the Chip Miller Charitable Foundation raise awareness of Amyloidosis, a rare and incurable plasma cell disorder that claimed the life of Chip Miller.

"People come to a race track to see the drivers in action," said Fitch, "but when I took the wheel of the No. 3 Corvette with Lance at my side, it was I who became the spectator. At parade lap speed, I could observe not only the thousands of fans who cheered us on, but also the emotions of my young passenger. His efforts to fulfill the dream of his father and best friend had paid off. It was a very special and satisfying experience."

"When you look at the Corvettes that raced at Le Mans 50 years ago, it's impossible not to be impressed by the passion,

the immense courage, and the physical stamina that was required to race for 24 hours in those vehicles," said Corvette Racing program manager Doug Fehan. "It was an astounding feat, and the men who drove them have my respect."


